## Science

### Evolution and Inheritance

To recognise that living things have changed over time and produce offspring of the same kind. To identify how animals and plants are adapted to suit their environment in different ways and that adaptation may lead to evolution. To explore the structure of the heart and lungs.

## History

### Victorian Children

To study the key features of the Victorian era, including the everyday lives of men, women and children of Victorian times.

To compare our lives nowadays to the life of Victorian people.

## Geography

### Let's Go to the Caribbean!

To understand about our world and its diverse places, people, resources.

To explore natural and human environments in a Caribbean country.

## Religious Education

### Rites of Passage

To find the ages and stages of life and investigate and respond to the ways in which the Christian, Muslim, Sikh and Hindu faiths mark stages and special events in the human life cycle.

## PHSCE

### Healthy Relationships

To explore health, hygiene and relationships, understanding the characteristics of positive relationships and how we should respect others, as well as ourselves, exploring the importance of self-respect.

## Design & Technology

### Designing and Making a Fairground Ride

To investigate a range of traditional Victorian fairground rides, exploring circuits with motors and how one can be incorporated into a model to create movement, creating a fairground ride to share with lower KS2 children, so that they can learn about life in the past.

## Art and Design

### Creating Landscapes

To explore the rural and/or urban landscape for two-dimensional work. To record observations through drawing and painting. To use shape, form, space, colour, texture and pattern to develop and communicate ideas in a painting.

## Music

### A New Year Carol and Keyboard Stage 3

To learn the songs and lyrics for a new carol and continue to learn about the language of music through playing the keyboard.

## PE

### Archery and Ultimate Frisbee

To follow the rules of archery while playing either target or field archery. To develop techniques such as ways to hold a Frisbee, send and receive a Frisbee, aim for a target with a Frisbee.

## MFL

### À la Plage (At the Beach) & Voyageurs Du Temps (Time Travellers)

To use new and familiar language to describe a busy beach scene, comparing beaches in the UK, France and other French-speaking cultures.

To explore the role of computing in British history, focusing on developments of computing over time and the effect this has on the modern world.
