I will look forward to making lots of new friends.




Each morning I will walk onto the Key Stage 2 playground and wait for the entrance door to open.


This entrance door is on the bottom playground.

In Year 4, I will learn lots of new and exciting things. This includes:



In English, we will read with increasing fluency, retell stories and predict what might happen next. We will also discuss our thoughts about a range of text types and use evidence from the text to make inferences about characters feelings and emotions. When writing, we will sequence ideas, use expanded noun phrases for description, use a wider range of conjunctions to link ideas in sentences and a range of sentence types for different purposes.



In Mathematics, we will develop our knowledge of number and place value, strategies for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division as well as investigating fractions, measures (including length, height, weight and volume), properties of shape, statistics and position and direction.




We will work scientifically when carrying out investigations. We will find out more about changing states of matter, electricity and sound, animals including humans and living things and their habitats.

In Geography, we will explore key countries, continents, physical and human features of the world, contrasting localities and the weather in UK and Europe.



In RE, we will investigate what the Bible is and why it is important to Christians, how Hindus worship in the Mandir and at home and the key leaders of different religions and why they are important.






We will hit the high notes in Music as we investigate a range of different musical genres. This includes Classical, Tango, Bhangra, Latina and Fusion.

In Computing, we will investigate how multimedia software can be used to create digital content, what simulations are and how we can programme them.

As we delve into the past, in History, we will investigate the Savage Saxons and Vicious Vikings and conduct a case study of our local city, by investigating the History of Wolverhampton .




In PHSCE, we will investigate the importance of our health and wellbeing, key issues such as Bullying, how we can manage conflict and the responsibilities we have as a global citizen.





In PE, we will work on key skills during a range of activities. This includes gymnastics, dance, net and wall games, striking and fielding invasion games.
